MY STORY

Born in Israel, I was raised by a single mother in a humble home, yet surrounded by a warm and loving extended family. Warmth has nothing to do with money, that's for sure!

The first war in my life broke when I was just a year old, and others followed. I still remember the incredible tension that came with threats of bombing, news of casualties and the next impending war. Perhaps it was those experiences that made me ponder the meaning of life at an early age and fuelled my interest in classics such as *War and Peace*, *Gone with the Wind*, *Atlas Shrugged* and others, when I was just ten years old.

Enriched by literary influences and life experience, I became increasingly interested in helping people transform their lives. I was only fourteen years old when I first volunteered to tutor two orphaned sisters raised by their mother in underprivileged circumstances and did so for the next four years, when mandatory military service took me elsewhere.

I entered the Israel Defence Forces (IDF) at the height of the Yom Kippur War.

What I remember most from boot camp: more than the early, cold winter mornings, the eighty-girl barrack, the military discipline, training and target shooting—is a very personal experience I will never forget.

While the war raged, the boot camp girls spent long days packaging food for the soldiers on the frontline. To help boost morale, we were asked to enclose notes for the soldiers. I wrote five notes...

Throughout boot camp I was deeply disturbed, as my boyfriend was in combat and had not been heard from in weeks. When he finally returned from battle, I discovered that one of my five notes had reached him! What are the odds?!

Following boot camp I volunteered to the IDF Teachers Corps and spent the next two years tutoring new immigrants on behalf of the military, helping them integrate into the culture. However, my commander hadn't told me that my duties would entitle a lot more than tutoring! Despite being eighteen, I became my students' confidant and inspiration. I knew everything about their spouses, children and family affairs; what troubled them and what brought them joy. Sometimes I'd show up to teach just to find that they had no plans for study. Instead, they had cooked for me and sought relief by sharing their latest woes. I loved my students, and they fuelled my passion for making a difference in people's lives.

My life experience had produced in me an irresistible urge to travel the world and find out more about people of all cultures and walks of life. So as a young IDF veteran, I rented a small room in the heart of Tel-Aviv and worked two jobs to save up for my travels. It was leaving home at a young age to meet challenges and fend for myself that built in me the confidence to backpack across Europe on my own for the following

seven months, starting in Athens, Greece and ending in the United Kingdom.

I was greatly enriched by my travels: from cozy Greek islands to grand churches in Italy; the beauty of Paris, Austrian villages, an Amsterdam canal where I lived in a boat house, hikes to abandoned churches and deserted villages; Switzerland, where I saw snow for the first time, and on and on. But most of all I was touched by the people.

I will never forget the Greek woman on a remote island who treated my sprained ankle after a hike. She didn't know my name nor did she ask for anything in return. She only knew I was in pain and needed help, and she cared for me as though I was her daughter. That was a lesson in kindness that is not taught in the highest academic institutions!

I remember the Australian sisters I met in Sicily who, after months of traveling together and fighting constantly, sought reprieve by having me join them. Or the group of friends I made in Austria, who would spend each morning "scoring" drugs in town while I roamed the picturesque city enjoying street musicians and my sobriety.

During my travels I met someone. We fell in love and got married. Our marriage started hopefully. We were a loving couple that friends looked to as a model. But four years later, without forewarning, my husband announced that he had fallen in love with someone else. Shocked and heartbroken, I didn't think I would ever recover.

It is through adversity that one discovers one's true strength. I overcame and moved on. Driven by the urge to make a difference, I started helping others to make the right relationship choices, build and preserve their love. In 1986, having traveled the world, lived and studied on three continents, I made California my home and established my coaching and consulting practice, which remains my focus and

passion to this day. I also married my native Los Angeleno husband, Robert, with whom I have enjoyed a strong and loving marriage.

Years of coaching experience taught me that most relationship failures start with picking the wrong match. That's why I dedicated my first book, ***PICKING RIGHT, The Single's Guide to Finding the Right Match***, to the subject of choosing the right partner.

Relationship Expert Daphna Levy Reveals Why Modern Marriage Is A Crapshoot And How To Not Become A Divorce Statistic

Relationship Expert, Author and Life Coach Daphna Levy recently released a new book, *Picking Right: The Single's Guide to Finding the Right Match*. It is the first in a series covering the gamut of relationships: from how to find one's match, how to maintain a relationship, through how to salvage one when it has gotten off the rails.

When asked why she wrote *Picking Right*, Levy explained, "Although many people come to me for Career and personal development, I often find that relationship issues provide distractions, which prevent them from focusing on their goals, on what they really want to achieve, sometimes really hampering them in their ability to be successful." She adds: "When I encounter a relationship that is beyond repair, beyond salvage, it usually started with a poor match: they picked wrong in the first place."

"We tend to ignore signs of trouble," says Levy. "For instance, the new mate might have a history of drug or alcohol abuse, or children from previous relationships he or she is neglecting. These are red flags; not to mention people who get involved with someone who is already in a relationship. It seldom occurs to such people that they have not found the 'faithful' type until they themselves are betrayed later on."

Levy provides what she calls "Three Vital Rules for Picking Right". "If you are driven, motivated and a 'go-getter' you have to pick someone who is similar, otherwise you will drive each other crazy. Secondly, if you are quick to think and act you will be unhappy with a mate who is indecisive or slow. Third, your goals must not be in conflict with each other. For example, if he wants a large family and she wants a career as a ballet dancer, they are probably incompatible. Love can only carry a relationship for so long before an inability to realize your own goals will get in the way," she adds.

According to a 2012 U.S. Census Bureau survey, 41% of first marriages end in divorce as well as 60% of second marriages and 73% of third marriages. "This is evidence that people do not have sound criteria for picking right," says Levy. She believes that the Three Vital Rules as well as other principles in her book hold promise for relationship longevity and success.

Marriage Counselor Debbie Collins writes in an Amazon review, "Great book for picking a partner. Written so it's easy to read and apply to your own life or to help another with theirs. Every so often there are exercises you can do so that you can really use the data."

Bestselling author Gladys Matar calls *Picking Right* the "missing link" in its field. "Many books on the shelf deliver their message with 'proofs and evidence,' which is very good. But Ms. Levy's book has more. It is unique among other books of the same kind for one specific reason: she gives you exercises on how to detect toxic mates, as she describes them in her book, how to gain clarity on your vision for everlasting and ideal relationship, and much more. In brief, she defines love from scratch so you can build your future relationship on a completely different basis," she adds.

Born and raised in Israel, Levy knew from a young age that she wanted to help people. She received her education as a Life Coach through training and experience on three continents—having lived and studied in Israel, the United States and South Africa. She began her career in 1986 and has since helped thousands of people through lectures, seminars and one-on-one Coaching as well as hosted her own live radio show for three years. She has been married to her native Los Angeleno husband for nearly thirty years.

Relationship Expert Daphna Levy Reveals Why Modern Marriage Is A Crapshoot And How To Not Become A Divorce Statistic



Relationship Expert, Author and Life Coach Daphna Levy recently released a new book, *Picking Right*



When I picked up (pun not intended) Daphna Levy's "Picking Right", I expected to discover a book about how to find the right match. What I found was much more. "Picking Right" shares the crucial ingredients necessary for a healthy and happy relationship, not only in the immediate present, but in the long-term. It challenges the current myths out there: namely that a good mate is hard to find. She reminds us that there are 7 billion people out there and that a relationship is a creation, not something that just happens to you. Levy reminds us, without beating around the bush I might add, to simply trust our own judgment and shows us how to avoid common mistakes. Finally, she points out what to watch out for and helps us identify the red flags we should never ignore.

The power of this book is also Levy's use of real-life examples to further explain her point of view. Rather than only using one person's experience, she reveals short examples of different people's lives and relationships. Her anecdotes and observations are not one-sided, contrary to so many other dating and relationship books; she is equally critical of men and women in abusive or dead-end relationships.

Often, reading a book about dating and relationships can be a passive experience, one in which we allow the focus to remain upon the author and individuals mentioned. Levy prevents us from doing this. Through powerful and practical exercises at the end of each chapter, she forces us, the readers, to stop and analyze our own choice of partner and further understand the status of our relationships. The author encourages us to challenge our own beliefs of what a positive relationship encompasses.

One of her exercises, for example, delves into whether or not the relationship we are in truly enhances our lives. She provides a relationship-math equation that should be obvious to us all, but can often prove to be ignored: "When the Pick is truly Right, $1+1=3$ or 4 or more. Both people thrive in the relationship. They are happier and more fulfilled than before. They accomplish more, both individually and as a team". She argues that if your partner and you add up to 2 or less than 2, you are not truly picking "right" as that person is not bringing any real value to your life.

Throughout the book Levy says things as they are: "This mushy emotion called "sympathy" is an unhealthy ingredient in a relationship. Use it to save a dying person or rescue an animal, but please don't marry someone for whom you feel sorry!" If you're not a fan of tough love, "Picking Right" isn't for you. However, if you want to ensure that you're choosing the right partner and you are committed to building an honest, trust-worthy and long-lasting relationship, this is the book you need on your nightstand.

If you could give only one piece of relationship advice, what would it be?

Treat your relationship like you would a garden: never stop cultivating it. You wouldn't dream of leaving a garden at the mercy of the elements, would you? Yet so many couples leave their relationship at the mercy of life's storms, hardships and routine. They take their "garden" for granted and expect it to bloom. Your Garden of Love must be nurtured or it will wither and die.

After five, ten, twenty years of marriage, what are the ways that you have found to prevent the other person from taking you for granted?

There must be a basic agreement between the couple that both will work to preserve the relationship and that they will not take each other for granted. There is always a contest between couples; instead of competing on who gets more, they should compete on who gives more. And each should seek to help the other and give more than they receive.

When couples have children, they say it changes the dynamics of their romantic relationship. What tips would you give to those couples who are expecting or planning on having children?

Remember that your union is the foundation of your family. Not only did your love for each other bring your kids into the world, but when they leave the nest one day, the two of you will remain. So grant your bond that importance and don't permit it to be diminished by your concern for the children.

Realize that you have two separate hats: as a mate as well as a parent. Do not dump one hat for the other. Work out how to continue wearing your hat as a mate while being a good parent. It can be done!

Do not permit your sexual life to deteriorate. Physical contact is a way of expressing your affection for each other and, as a means of communication, it increases affection. If hormonal changes interfere with your sexuality, seek nutritional help and try to get more rest. It is hard to feel sexual when the body is ill, tired or nutritionally deficient.

Daphna Levy is a relationship expert who has spent years guiding others through coaching, workshops and seminars. What sorts of questions do you think you should ask your partner before committing to marriage?

In my book I call this "The Interview." You definitely want to find out everything you can before you tie the knot. Don't leave "holes" in key issues that impact your future together. You should ask questions such as:

What are your goals regarding a family? Do you want children? How soon and how many?

What are your views on fidelity?

What are your career plans?

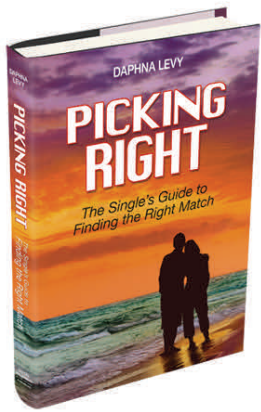
What are your religious views or commitments?

What is your stand (and behavior) regarding drug and alcohol use?

There are many more questions you could ask. But to do so effectively you need to know what you are looking for. Then you ask questions to ensure that your and your future spouse's worlds harmonize.

You have experienced a long and happy marriage. How and in what ways has the love changed over the years, if at all?

Our love deepened. It is no longer based on a brief acquaintance accompanied by great affection, but on years of genuine friendship. We have grown and developed together; we have been through misfortune and helped one another every step of the way. As we developed individually, we've also had to adapt ourselves so as to permit one another to achieve our individual goals within the relationship. (We never wanted to squash each other.) It's been a journey throughout which we've been best friends. So I'd say, our relationship better now and our love stronger than it was thirty years ago.
